• Heart disease is the leading cause of death for all Americans, including American Indians and Alaska Natives (AI/AN) More AI/AN men and women over age 45 die from Cardiovascular Disease than any other disease • CVD is the second leading medical cause of death after cirrhosis for Indian men and women ages 15 -44
